Journal of Conflict and Peace Studies is a biannual interdisciplinary and international journal of the Department of History and International Studies, University of Uyo, Nigeria. The Journal seeks to advance robust historical, empirical, theoretical, conceptual and critical research into the mutating dynamics of conflict and the construction of peace in the international system at the global, regional, subregional and community level over time. The Journal seeks for manuscripts that assist in extending our knowledge curve on conflict studies (Polemology/conflictology) and peace studies (Irenology), but focuses significantly on the cause and effect relationship between conflict and peace using the individual, state, and system levels of analysis. Articles that make original contribution to knowledge in our understanding the problems of conflict and peace stand the best chance of being accepted.

Manuscripts should be submitted electronically to ubongumoh@uniyo.edu.ng. Submitted manuscripts, using Century Gothic font size 10, should adopt footnote documentation/citation style. Total word count is restricted to 8,500 or fewer words. Fully anonymized manuscripts should begin with an abstract of no more than 150 words. Reviews of recently published books relating to conflict and peace in the international system are encouraged. Manuscripts are welcome all year round, but are published twice a year (May and November). However, those still interested in the November 2015 Issue are encouraged to turn in their manuscripts no latter than April 4, 2016. The deadline for submission for May 2016 and November 2016 Issues are April 4 and October 18, respectively.

Submission of manuscript implies commitment to publishing in the Journal. Authors submitting manuscript to the Journal should not simultaneously submit them to another Journal or book, nor should manuscript have been published elsewhere in substantially similar form or with substantively similar content. **Journal of Conflict and Peace Studies** operates a double-blind peer review process in which the reviewer's name is withheld from the author and the author's name is withheld from the reviewer. However, for the purpose of acknowledgement, reviewers may at their own discretion opt to reveal their name to the author in their review.

Journal of Conflict and Peace Studies, as an international Journal, abhors the use of "nationalistic" language such as the use of "us" or "our" for their own nation or group of nations and "them" for others. We encourage gender-neutral language whenever possible. Colloquialism, particularly if linked to a particular national culture, should be avoided. Also, acronyms and abbreviations should be seldom used. It is advised that acronyms or abbreviations when used should be explained the first time they occur.
